



## **Environmental Report**

The day was May 23rd, 2016 when my wife Cindy was heading off to work as normal. She headed out the door and noticed that one of the plants outside the front door was wilted and thought she should give it a drink before heading off. Cindy started towards the faucet across the vard when suddenly to her left just beyond her Jeep was a Doe. The deer was very nervous and agitated and was pacing back and forth in the driveway. Cindy was very cautious at this point but not afraid because the deer here are not afraid of us and come here on a regular basis. Cindy continued towards the faucet and got a bucket of water. She heard a noise down by the faucet, a bleating noise. She then saw a newborn Fawn lying just there at the faucet. At this point, the Doe was getting even more upset, and Cindy headed quickly back to the house giving the doe some space with her newborn. She watered the plant, came in and told me about the incident and left for work. Over the next few hours, I watched the Fawn with its shaky little legs, still wet and trying to walk and nurse at the same time. Over the next few days, the Doe and Fawn were regular visitors, usually stopping by the faucet for a minute or so, not sure why but it was starting to be routine as they lounged around the yard for awhile before moving on. It was fun to see the Fawn growing stronger and being able to keep up with mom. The neighbors have a wire field fence that is 4+ feet tall at our respective property lines; the fence is not even a bump in the road for the Doe but a newborn a bit of a challenge. I would watch as the Doe would hop the fence and wait patiently on the other side for her Fawn to do the same. It never had the same spring in its legs as mom did but it would try, and a few times would only make it part way and get stuck in the holes of the fence. It would wiggle its way thru the holes, and they would go on their merry way. This routine went on for a few days, the Doe hopping back and forth showing how easy it was to get over the fence. But the fawn was nervous I'm thinking it didn't like getting stuck and was growing pretty fast. I wasn't sure what the mom would do if I had to rescue the little guy. After several weeks the Fawn still wasn't willing to jump the fence, but they would find a way around after the Doe would show her technique of hopping over. After several weeks the visits were not every day but almost and I could see that Mom was trying to teach her Fawn to stay put as she would roam a little further away out of sight of the Fawn. One evening at dusk we were watching the two of them out in the back yard, the fawn nestled down in between some tall ferns growing in the back yard. Mom had jumped the fence but was still in sight. All of a sudden we saw two Raccoons come out of the woods heading for the Fawn. The Doe had also seen the raccoons at the same time; she was over the fence before you could blink. She was kicking and jumping around so fast it was hard to tell what was happening. We had no idea that a raccoon would attack a Fawn. The Mom won that round and the raccoons headed for the woods as fast as they came. The Fawn, safe for now, just stood around for awhile and then moved on for the night. We didn't see the two of them for a few days after that night and in fact when the Doe finally did come back there was no Fawn with her. We thought the Fawn was just hiding but over the last week or so she has been alone. We have a steady stream of deer come thru on a regular basis. On the Fourth of July, before all the fireworks, I counted nine different deer. I have the photos of Mom & Fawn and hopefully next year we'll have a new Fawn to watch. ----


Add and simmer for 45) minutes.
