

So, be safe out there and keep that sun screen handy!



The June 5th - 2 classes a week ABC Class tested on June 19th with 10 students passing. Thanks to P/C Lance Williamson for organizing and putting the class on.

Tacoma Yacht Club has made it's facility available for an ABC Basic Boating Class to be held starting Thursday September 14th 07:00 PM- 09:00PM. Tell your friends, who are new to boating or would like to learn more and may be in need of a "Washington State Boat Operators Card, to give us a call or email and sign up for the class. It will run for 5 sessions including the exam.

We could use some volunteers willing to go out with skippers who are desirous for on the water demonstrations of various aspects of boat handling. We are getting requests for this activity. If you would be willing to help out, please let me know so we can assist these skippers.

WE CAN HELP!! During the boating season experienced members can do on the water demonstrations and instruction on a member's boat. The requirements are that the boat have a current Vessel Safety Check and decal, and that the time and date of the on the water demonstration be approved by the Squadron Executive Board. If you would like to hone your talents at close quarters boat handling, let me know and we can put something together. This is a great way to assist a member who is learning about their new boat. The United States Power Squadrons has liability insurance that covers these approved activities, as long as we follow the guidelines.

No-Discharge Zone (NDZ): We don't have a lot of new information to report here. Charlie Costanzo (American Waterways Operators), attorney James Tupper, and the Marine Alliance continue to work the "request for reconsideration" angle. We have been advised that they were scheduled to have a meeting with EPA Director Scott Pruit last week, arranged with the assistance of Senator Patty Murray. No results of that meeting have been released as of June 8th.

State adoption of an update to the National Electrical Code (NEC): Unbeknownst to those of us in recreational boating circles, the code had been updated at the federal level without meaningful recreational boaters' input, and the state Department of Labor & Industries was poised to adopt it July 1, 2017. Changes to the NEC included a 30 milli-amp (mA) ground protection standard that would have been unachievable for many marinas and would have made electrical upgrades of marinas impossible to undertake. We had already heard of an upgrade at the Roche Harbor Marina being put on hold.

The good news is that our colleagues with NMTA got involved in a late effort to amend and/or delay the implementation of the ground-protection standard, and RBAW got involved as well. With two organizations now registering concerns, with two state legislators making inquiries, and with RBAW asking L&I's Legislative Director for an Agency-stakeholder meeting, we got results; postponement of the effective date of the L&I adopting the NEC as published to July 1, 2018.

Regulatory issue - Hull Identification Number (HIN) Registration/Reporting Changes: Discussions with the Department of Licensing (DOL) are progressing well. While a pending U.S. Coast Guard rule-making could have led to significant upheaval for all those who sell, trade, register, or re-register vessels, we've bought time to educate boaters and brokers and establish a system where existing HIN numbers can at least be preserved somewhere on the re-registration form (likely in the "Comment" portion).

Operating Budgets: If no Operating Budget is agreed upon by July 1, non-essential parts of state government (such as State Parks) will be required to shut down until a 2017-19 budget is in place. It's worth noting that agencies are developing contingency plans that impact staff, contracts with outside parties, reservations for use of state facilities, and more.
