Happy Holidays members and welcome to the last month of the year. It is hard to

believe the year is almost over. But I'm very happy you are still here as am I. I could not let the year end without writing a few words about a true American Hero (in my opinion) that

passed away in 2021. A man that had the personal courage to admit publicly when he made a mistake while serving the nation as a civilian. A man that was refused the use of bars and restaurants at the beginning of his military career in Georgia, but still served for 35 years in the Army. A man that served in positions such as the United States National Security Advisor under President Ronald Reagan, Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff under President George H. W. Bush and President Bill Clinton, and the 65th United States Secretary of State under George W Bush. Some of you have guessed who I am writing the last article of the year about. For everyone else, I am writing about Colin Luther Powell.

Colin L. Powell was the child of immigrant parents from Jamaica. He was born on the 5th of April, 1937 in Harlem New York. His dad was a shipping clerk and his mother a seamstress. He attended high school in the South Bronx. The school is closed now but it was called Morris High School. The Bronx is where he grow-up and Morris is the high school he graduated from in 1954. After high school he attended the City College of New York (CCNY). During his college days he found out he was good at ROTC, and he enjoyed it. In 1958 he became Second Lieutenant Colin Powell. He graduated with a Bachelor's Degree in Geology and earning an Army Commission that changed his life forever. LT Powell your journey is just beginning.

His first Duty Station was for training in Georgia. In Georgia in 1958 he was denied service in restaurants, bars and I'm sure many other facilities. Through it all he gave the country 35 years of his life in uniform. Retiring as Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff which is a Four Star General position, and the highest ranking position possible. The Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff is the most Senior Officer in the United States Armed Forces. The position is the military advisor to the President, National Security Council, Homeland Secretary Council and the Secretary of Defense. After 35 years of active duty, he retired his uniform in 1993. In January of 2001 he put on a suit and tie to serve the country again as the 65th United States Secretary of State until January 2005. Colin Powell was awarded numerous decorations both during civilian and military service to the nation. What made him even more respectable to me was the courage to admit publicly a mistake he made during his civilian service to the nation. Unfortunately that is a rare sight with politicians in America today.


Colin Powell died on the 18th of October 2021 fighting battles on three fronts. The battle of time, he was 84. The battle against Blood Cancer (Myeloma) that has a negative effects on the immune system. And the battle against COVID-19 which he had complications with. At the end, the son of Luther Theophilus Powell a shipping clerk and Maud Powell a seamstress lost the war of life as we all will in the future. He was an American hero in my eyes that paved the way for Soldiers like me. Colin Powell broke many glass ceilings. Happy Holidays Members. I hope this article will peak the interest of someone. Maybe they will take a few minutes to look up a true American Hero, Colin Powell. Sir, I salute you, Thank you for your service to our country both in and out of uniform.


