Environmental Report

Proposed Methanol Plant in Tacoma's Tide Flats

k, I'm only going to touch on this subject that has so many up in arms. So for now, the World's largest proposed methanol plant (one of three in Washington State) is on hold. That's not to say that the project is dead by any means. The proposed plant is planned to be built on the old Kaiser Aluminum smelter site. The site was bought by the Port of Tacoma in early 2002. The site cleanup took more than ten years and a ton of money to clean it up, after the

closure of the former smelter. The facts of what a Methanol plant would cost in terms of natural resources used, pollution caused, and the potential hazards associated with the manufacture and storage of Methanol are <u>not all in</u>. For a lot of people, who have been around the area for many years, watching the changes made for a better Tacoma are not so keen on maybe taking a step backwards. Having a spouse that works in the Port, and who has literally been stuck trying to get out of the Port with the train movements and truck traffic, has a big influence in our household on how our vote goes. Of course we don't actually get a vote. The fact that it's difficult under normal circumstances to travel in, out and around the Port area, is something worth considering in the mix with all the other factors. One factor of course would be the estimated 300,000 tons of methanol in storage waiting for transport to China.

I have read many of the news reports that have been published, and in my opinion there seems to be a lot more negative consequences than positive. Something like 14.4 million gallons of water needed each day for the process of converting natural gas to methanol, and what happens to the spent water. Or the 450 megawatts of electrical power that will be required to run the plant and process after start up. One megawatt of power would keep approx. 500 homes running. (this is a highly variable figure, depending on weather, time of day, etc.) anyway that's a lot of power. Now on the positive side, big money will be spent, some jobs will be created. But for the Environment I'm not sure there is one. Only time will tell whether it is one of those I told you so moments. And on a more personal note our boat is moored less than a mile from the site. With construction that will take years in an already very busy port, well maybe that's one reason it's on hold for now? Just more to think about!




