Recreational Boating Association of Washington (RBAW)

This report is published with permission of Past Commodore Day Island Yacht Club Chuck Gay. These reports will keep us updated on the current Washington legislation regarding area boaters.

May 2020 RBAW Report for DIYC

While there have of course been other issues on our radar this last month, in many ways it seems it has been "all COVID-19, all the time." Our lobbyist, Doug Levy, has been closely tracking and advocating on the Governor's special "Stay at Home, Stay Healthy" Executive Orders, the goings-on in Congress with COVID-19 relief, and the very distinct possibility that the Legislature could go into a Special Session this summer or fall. <u>Recreational boating and outdoor recreation in general were among the first activities to be "re-opened" by the Governor.</u> That's been no accident – we and our colleagues at the Northwest Marine Trade Association (NMTA) have put countless hours in on these issues.

COVID-19 – Governor's Stay at Home, Stay Healthy Order – Phased Re-Openings of activities: As alluded to at the outset of this report, getting people back on the water and getting the recreational boating sector up and on its feet has been a major point of emphasis for us. We've conducted calls with State Parks, we put together a joint letter to the Governor on re-opening recreational boating and fishing. The news that recreational boating is a 'go' as of May 5, and that vehicle and vessel sales have a green light as of May 15, is heartening.

Lakebay Marina: Even in the face of an economy that has fallen through the floor and a charitable donations world that has changed overnight, we keep plugging away on this one. We are working on a \$400,000 Heritage Capital Projects grant due to the historic nature of Lakebay, and among our lobbyist and others, we have some tentacles out to Foundations. We're still going to need to figure out innovative ways to get to a Lakebay acquisition by the end of September, but we have some potential ideas.

NOAA/NMFS Marina Mitigation Issue: I wish I could tell you I had some encouraging news to report on this front. Unfortunately, that is anything but the case. RBAW President Bob Wise, Logan Brown of Marine Floats, Peter Schrappen of NMTA, and our lobbyist had an April 30 GoToMeeting discussion and call with Jennifer Quan of the National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) regional office. It became very clear to us that we are nowhere closer to a "programmatic permit" and to reasonable cost details, outlines, etc., than we were over a year ago when we started down this road.

Derelict Vessel Removal Program (DVRP): Our lobbyist is working to set up with-staff and with-Commissioner Hilary Franz meetings in May and June with the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) to discuss the DVRP and future funding of it. The landscape – or should I say 'seascape' – has changed dramatically, of course. We also want to discuss some of our ideas on Lakebay with Hilary Franz as well.

No Discharge Zones: Not a ton to report here. The Department of Ecology and its marketing/communications consultant continue to work on best practices for informing boaters about the Puget Sound-wide NDZ that is in effect, while the American Waterway Operators' (AWO's) continues to work on a legal challenge. 
