**H**ello Everyone and Happy Holidays!

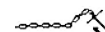

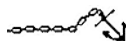

Reservation fee is \$11, a far cry from the cost if TPS tried to reserve 12 slips. Hudson Point Marina is a popular stop and will fill quickly. They are not always superfast to return calls. I’ve experienced responses from nothing heard to the next day up to three days later. I have connected to a live person twice in 10 calls. In short, make the call sooner than later. Once you have reserved, please let me know. In fact, let me know of your intention to attend any or all cruise destinations once you have decided. With the skinny schedule, the cruise would be a great way to put some holes in the water and catch up with friends.

## 2020 Tacoma Yacht Club's annual Lighted Boat Parade

The Lighted Boat Parade is open to any and all boats that are decorated and want to join in.

- Saturday 12/19/2020
- Boats will assemble in front of the Point Defiance docks (by Anthony's) before 5:30-pm
- The start of the parade will commence after the 5:30 departure of the WSF M/V Chetzemoka from the Point Defiance ferry dock
- The Sea Scout Ship, the Charles N. Curtis will lead the parade, past the Tacoma Yacht Club, along the Tacoma waterfront, and down the Foss Waterway.
- The next 3 boats will be the Bridge of the Tacoma Yacht Club
- After that; the the remaining boats can file in (in any order)
- All boats are requested to monitor VHF-72
- Each boat will call into the Tacoma Yacht Club on VHF-72 as they pass the TYC flagpole to announce their Boat Name, introduce their Skipper, identify their yacht club (if any), and offer a season's greeting
- TYC (only) Boats will be judged as they pass the TYC outstation at the Dock Street Marina in the Foss Waterway
- Winners will be announced on VHF-72 shortly after all boats have passed the judge's boat M/Y Forever
- Boats wishing to stay the night at the Dock Street Marina need to make reservations directly with the Dock Street Marina
- Due to COVID there will be no formal after-parade gathering this year
- Boats not staying at Dock Street are requested to continue on to the end of the Foss Waterway and turn around just before the bridge (turn to port / counter-clockwise) so boats passing in the waterway are port-to-port
- Sailboats: The Murray Morgan Bridge has a 59' vertical clearance at a 10' tide. The high tide on 12/19/20 will be at 7:47pm and will be roughly 9'-2". Any sailboat with a vertical draft of 60' or higher will need the bridge raised.

## From the Galley

We were talking about food last night at the meeting and our recipes. I know it's probably too late for Thanksgiving, but I'm sharing my Pumpkin Pie recipe (maybe for Christmas?) and my leftover Turkey Recipe. The pumpkin pie started out as a basic recipe years ago and I've gradually changed it. It's got a good spicy flavor, and everyone seems to really like it.

Yes, I do replace 1 TBS of the milk for the Kahlua.

The Turkey Barley Soup recipe I got from a magazine and really liked it. I make a full batch and end up freezing it in containers to use with the cold weather coming in (It's great to have homemade soup on a cold rainy day).

Bon Appetite and have a wonderful Thanksgiving!

### Pumpkin Pie

Pastry for a 1-crust 9" pie	¼ teaspoon Ground Cloves
3 Eggs, lightly beaten	1 ¾ cups canned Pumpkin
¾ cup <b>Dark</b> Brown Sugar, packed	1 ½ cups undiluted Evaporated Milk
½ teaspoon Salt, optional	1 Tablespoon Molasses
¾ teaspoon Ground Ginger	OPTIONAL: (but makes it excellent!)
¼ teaspoon Cinnamon	1 Tablespoon Kahlua
¼ teaspoon Nutmeg	

- Preheat oven to 425 degrees with the rack near the bottom
- Prepare the pastry shell with standing fluted rim. Brush with a little of the beaten egg and chill while preparing the filling.
- Mix the remaining beaten eggs with all the other ingredients.
- Pour into the prepared pie shell and bake until a knife inserted near the center comes out clean, about 40 – 45 minutes.

Note - If you choose the extra optional liquids at the end of the recipe, it may be a longer cooking time (approx 10+ min), so protect your crust with foil. Or you can cut down 1 TBS of the Evaporated Milk to compensate.

Crust = 192

Brown Sugar = 214

Pumpkin = 22

Evaporated Milk = 36

Molasses = 15

**Total Carbs for entire pie = 479**

**1/8 piece = 60 carbs**

**1/6 piece = 96 carbs**

## **Turkey Barley Soup**

Makes about 10 servings, but this freezes very well.

8 cups turkey stock made from leftover turkey carcass (or could use chicken stock, but turkey stock is better)

1 T olive oil (or butter)

1 onion, diced in 3/8 inch pieces

1 cup celery, diced in 3/8 inch pieces

2 cups carrots, diced in 3/8 inch pieces

2 tsp. poultry seasoning, or more, to taste (can substitute dried thyme and sage for poultry seasoning)

black pepper to taste

4 cups diced leftover turkey

4 cups water

3/4 cup pearl barley

Turkey soup base as needed (I used about 1 T Penzey's Turkey Soup Base. Can also use chicken bouillon, a dash of soy sauce, or Kitchen Bouquet if you need to add flavor)

In very large frying pan, heat olive oil, add onion and saute 2 minutes. Add carrots, celery, poultry seasoning, and pepper and saute about 5 minutes more.

While vegetables are cooking, bring turkey stock to a boil in large soup pot. Add vegetables and turkey, lower heat, and simmer 20 minutes.

Add water, bring soup back to simmer, then add barley and simmer until barley is soft, at least 30 minutes, and maybe longer, depending on how old the barley is. (When I made this recently I cooked the barley 45 minutes, but fresh barley will cook much more quickly.)

When barley is cooked, taste soup for seasoning, add additional turkey soup base and salt or pepper if needed. Simmer 10 minutes more if more soup base is added. Serve hot.

Currently we have \$14,170.89 in our Operating account, \$7,410.98 in Savings, and \$414.27 in our Cruise Account for a Total \$21,996.14.
- Jackie will do an Audit of our records going forward.

**Education Officer – Lt/C Bentley Rickmers, S**

- ABC has 18 people in class. Piloting is continuing on Thursday nights.
- On 1/16/21 an Advanced Piloting Class will begin. Contact Gary Ball or Bentley Richmers if you are interested in enrolling.
- Seminar being offered via Zoom – Introduction to Navigation – only 1 night. Bentley will put an article on classes in the Wake Astern from various Zoom classes around the nation. National is into the testing strategy for the various Zoom classes being held.

**Commander – Cmdr Gary Dildine, AP, IN -**

- Not a lot to report. Got feedback with the cards we sent out. Had a small Zoom meeting turnout.

**NEW BUSINESS**

- **2021 Summer Cruise** – Stan Wolfe –Port Townsend is making it very difficult to get a reservation in place. Each individual who will be on the cruise will need to call and reserve their space individually. They will reserve 70' slips. Richard has sent out instructions via email to have us call Port Townsend directly to reserve. Because it is difficult to get in due to the popularity in the summer, Stan will send an email to remind people to send in deposit. \$11 deposit. (Point Hudson Marina). It was asked if people can transfer their reservation closer to the time? Stan will look into it for an answer. Richard will send the schedule out again.
- **Assistant Treasurer position** - Assistant Treasurer – Jackie Mattox was approved by the board for this position. Jackie will get the QuickBooks set up and then turn it back to Aaron.
- **General Meeting** – Asking for ideas on presentation. Suggested that Stan could talk about the Summer Cruise. Larry Warren to talk about Christmas drive. Maybe some canned presentations from National as well were suggested. We do want to ask about Rendezvous and scheduling feedback from members.
- **December Meetings** – We will have a Zoom Executive Board meeting, but not a General Meeting.
- **Samuel Hill** - is taking his Boat Handling class test tomorrow in Seattle.
- **Email for Minutes** - Sam Hill suggested setting up an email for our monthly minutes, so any member has access to them. Tom Ferree has volunteered to set it up. We will use the "Tacoma Power Squadron" name in some configuration to get it set up.

**OLD BUSINESS**

- **Storage and retention of old records / meeting minutes** – Beth talked to the National Secretary. We are allowed to have all records going forward in a digital format (i.e., Word, Excel, PDF, etc.) The rules are now that we only have to retain 7 years of our previous business meetings. However, if we want to retain longer than the time frame designated, National Headquarters can store them for us. One of the reasons is to have an historical

**record of our chapter. Beth will go through the 2 boxes of records at the beginning of the year and report back on an inventory of the contents. At that time, we can decide what can be kept or stored at National.**

- **USPS Virtual Trainer** – Bentley reported that we will eventually keep the trainer within our chapter, as we can have it transferred to us at any time. She stated that retention needs to be dependent on finding a storage place to keep it in good condition. However, other squadrons want to be able to use it within the next month. Need a training to have all the squadrons learn how to set it up. Gail in Seattle will set up the training and we can go and learn how to use the Trainer. We will get it to keep in storage, once the training in Seattle has been completed. Bentley will let us know when we will have the training. Includes two monitors, steering columns, virtual, etc.
- **DIYC Lease agreement** – Nothing to report. Waiting to hear back on our counter offer.
- **Toy Drive Dec 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> @ Tacoma Yacht Club** – from 12:00 – 2:00 pm in their parking lot. Larry will drive over to TYC on Friday to talk and get logistics from the yacht club. Discussed logistics of a vehicle lined up to put the toys and food in. Jackie & Richard have volunteered for one day and Larry on the other day. Richard will send out an email next week to remind members. Due to Covid-19 considerations, it will be in the TYC parking lot and all safety of members will be observed.
- **Clean up and sort Squadron materials in Sharps barn** – Olympia Squadron stored their information there when they merged with Tacoma. There are items that may or may not be of use. Maybe some of the members who live a little south who can volunteer their time for a few hours? A date has not been decided yet. Depends on volunteer availability.
- Search for a battery for **AED – Defibrillator**. Stan had to contact a place in Ireland who sent him to a contact in Seattle. Price may be \$186. He is looking into it more and should have results in the next month.
- Email from National. Program has been set up to forgive loans for small businesses and non-profits. National had a \$165K loan. The government has confirmed that the loan has been forgiven in full. National will use the savings to be able to keep staff on payroll and continue with services throughout the nation.
- We still have a \$500 gift card from Mama Sortinis. If they go out of business, we will lose it. However, we can apply through the state to get our money back. If this happens. It was initially a deposit for our Change of Watch dinner meeting that did not happen due to Covid-19 restrictions. It was asked if we can change our large amount to smaller amounts. Some of the ideas were to give to First Responders or can we have a raffle for people who attend the general meeting. We will ask for members to come up with ideas. Gary will keep track of the ideas that come in and a decision will be made. Larry will look into being able to convert the larger amount into 10 smaller ones.

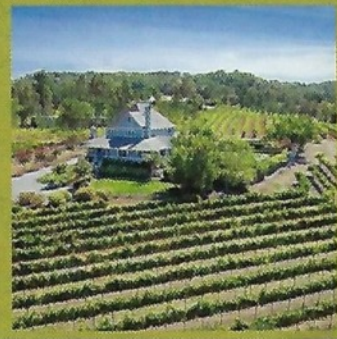
