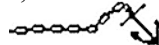
Hope everyone is enjoying the holiday season. It's not over yet, we still have Christmas coming up fast. I'm going to spend a few minutes talking about what I believe will help with attendance. Attendance has not been great in 2022. Some members believe it's because of COVID-19. I agree, that could be some of the problem. I still see people wearing masks in stores sometimes. I'm sure however, many members that do not participate in club events, but do go on other outings (restaurants, church, movies, trips on planes, etc.).

What I propose is very simple with minimum commitment to the members that are not attending events. Folks I see all the time will not be affected because they come to events anyway. I propose that members are required to make only three events in two years to stay in good standing. I also propose that we look for reasons to make members want to attend. I believe having a requirement for attendance, and members having fun at events will make a difference. How would the requirement piece work? I thought you would never ask:

- Starting at the beginning of the year (or pick a month), three events (two meetings and one rendezvous or any combination of the two) would be required to attend by all members that year (example, from January 2023 to January 2024)
- If a member cannot attend the three events in 12 months, they are informed by both email and regular mail, they did not meet the requirement
- Members will have the following year to make the three-event requirement
- If a member does not make the three-event requirement the following year, they are not in good standing until they make three events
- Members not in good standing do not pay dues and do not have any of the benefits an active member has. The fix is to make three events
- Members that only live in town for 6 months a year, need to make one event
- Members that live out of town are exempt
- Day Island Yacht Club can be the base (75 miles from Day Island is out of town)
- Members that have health problems or taking care of someone with a health problem that stops them from attending events are exempt

This proposal will not alone motivate members to come to events. Of course, we must have interesting things for members to do when they are at events. I believe the two together will have a positive effect on member participation. At the last meeting, we had a lot of hands going up with great ideas. I challenge members with ideas to come to the next executive board meeting and explain how to implement their idea, and what part they will play in implementing them. One member thought it is a terrible (I think that was the term) idea to have any requirements. I ask that member and any other member, why is it so terrible? I also understand people do not like change. I believe when an organization (this applies to people also) want everything done the way it's always been, that organization's growth potential is limited. Hoping to see some new faces at the executive board meeting explaining their plan for their idea. All are welcome at the executive board meetings. I work out of town a lot and I vacation a lot out of town. I still come to plenty of events and try to help as much as possible.

What's included?

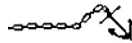
- Advanced positioning techniques, such as advancing a line of position to obtain a running fix

- Hazard avoidance techniques using electronics (e.g. avoidance waypoints or safety zones in GPS)
- Collision avoidance using radar, GPS, and AIS
- Working with the tide and current data to determine clearances, depth of water, and effects of current
- Piloting in various wind and current conditions

Price for members of America’s Boating Club is \$70 and non-members \$110. Students should have taken Piloting before taking AP.

New Business:

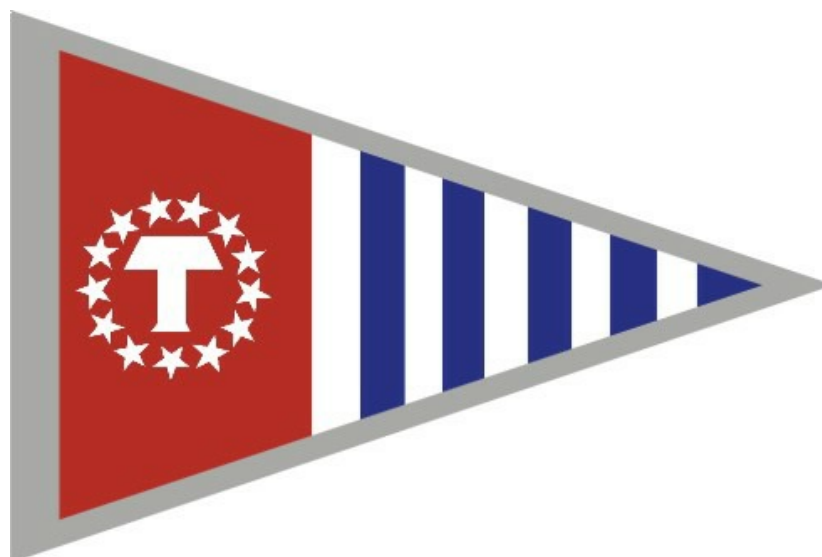

Executive Board Minutes for Oct 2022. There were no corrections. Motion was presented to accept, seconded, and were approved.

- Stan needs names for the Nominating committee. These are the positions he will be calling around to try and fill:

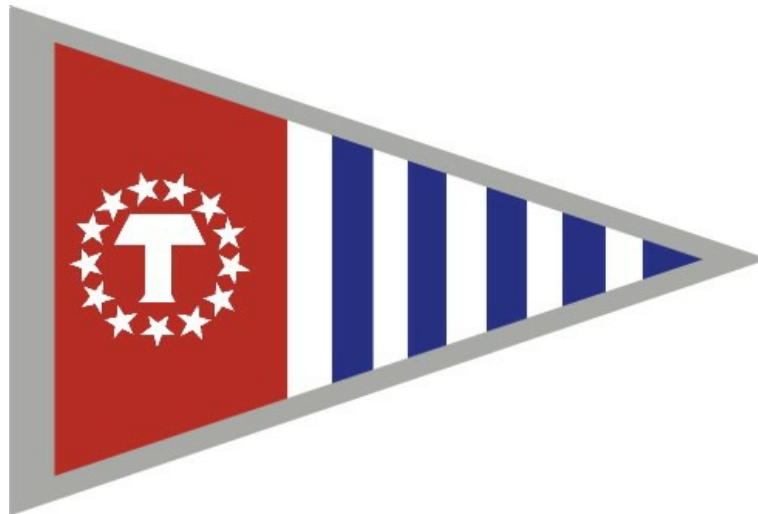

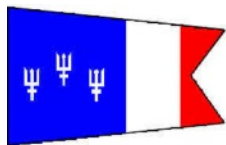

AIS Works!

“Motor vessel GreyWolfes, motor vessel GreyWolfes, this is schoooooooo (unintelligible name).” Hey, that’s someone calling us on VHF! Who can see us in this fog?

We had spent a couple of days at the Bainbridge Island Marine Park dock and had just departed Eagle Harbor heading south. There was thick fog with about 200 yards visibility but the fog bank was low enough that it was also sunny. As we passed the Blakely Rocks day beacon, the call came with just enough reception to know the call was to our boat. I responded but without being able to discern the calling station, my response was to “last calling station.” Hearing nothing further, we continued south at about eight knots with running lights on and our automatic foghorn making one long blast every two minutes. At that speed, we could easily stop within half the distance we could see. I scanned ahead and to starboard while Deb scanned to port and behind us.

I was pondering how a vessel could see us in the thick fog, especially since our boat name is visible only from viewing our forward flybridge. I realized that the only way another vessel could see us and know our name was through the use of our AIS. I had installed an AIS transponder in the spring and this was our first hailing.

I looked at the AIS symbols on my Garmin multifunction display and noted some targets in various locations around me. A few minutes later, the vessel called us again and I could make out their name, “Lotus Blossom”. I responded to the call and shifted to VHF channel 13 per the skipper’s request. Yup, he had spotted me on his AIS and wished to coordinate a safe crossing. He told me he was a freighter having departed Manchester Bay, proceeding north bound, and requested I pass astern of him. I noted one target in the area but it was identified as “UKN” (Unknown). I indicated to him I would stop and wait until I could confirm his location and proceed south behind him. After a few minutes, Lotus Blossom emerged from the fog bank, superstructure clearly visible and after passing us the entire vessel was visible. A quick scan of his stern with the binoculars confirmed it was Lotus Blossom. Well, AIS works!

Just a quick note on the install. I consulted with Ken Jacobson, formerly of J&G Marine, who now works for Breakwater at the old fuel dock. I purchased a SI-TEK transponder and since I didn’t want to mess with splicing tiny wires for a NMEA083 based connection, I decided to also upgrade to a NMEA2000 backbone. As an authorized service technician, Ken programmed the transponder and sold me the dedicated, separate GPS antenna required for the transponder, and all the cabling to include terminators. It took me a couple of hours to run the cabling, mount the hardware, and power up the components. I was impressed with how easy it was, especially the NMEA2000 standard that allowed my Garmin MFD and SI-TEK transponder to connect to the same backbone.

Well, on to the next project!

GEODETIC PHOTOS

Fellow Co-op Charting and geodetic recovery participants. This information hopefully will help you to provide the most useful information possible to NGS when you're out and about finding geodetic markers.

Before you depart for your search and are looking up available PID's, as you find those that you're going out to find, check the datasheet to see if there are photographs of the mark and its general field location. If there aren't any, then it becomes all the more important to take good photographs of the mark and its surrounding area so that they can be uploaded to NGS and then added to the latest datasheet.

For sure, the most important photo is a clear close-up showing the stamped information whenever possible. Then next is an overhead shot which is basically at about head height. Lastly, you want to take one or two "landscape" photos making sure that you identify where in the photo the mark is located. Use some type of ground reference to sit beside the mark that is clearly visible.

If you're using the Solocator APP, first make sure in the settings that you have checked both buttons in the save to camera roll section showing green. This will save two photos each time you take one, one showing data directly on the photo and the other is plain (info is imbedded in the properties of the photo). When photos are submitted to NGS, they want only the plain photo so you don't need to include the data showing photo except when doing the close-up which then you need to include both in your report.

Adding these photos to the datasheet will help a potential user of the mark in their finding its location thus adding to the significance of your efforts.

As for labeling these photos, please use the following:

Close-up (data showing): PID-NAME-0-YYYYMMDD

Close-up (plain): PID-NAME-1-YYYYMMDD

Overhead (plain): PID-NAME-2-YYYYMMDD

Landscape (plain): PID-NAME-3(compass)-YYYYMMDD

Visit the [NGS website](#) for more information.

Also, if you're searching and searching to no avail and thus need to report a mark as NOT FOUND, please submit as much information about your search as you can along with a Landscape photo of the area (labeled properly). This has as much significance to NGS as if you report a "destroyed". The only way we're to submit a "DESTROYED" is to have either the disk in hand or showing that it's completely dislodged from its base. And then you have to submit a photo of it either as a close-up or landscape in which it is clearly identified.

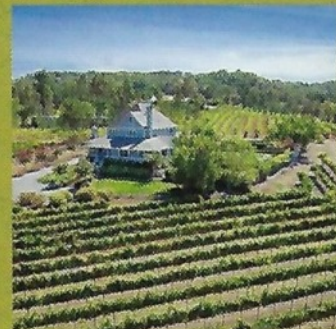
