Greetings from your Commander!

America's Boating Club of Tacoma and South Puget Sound has made the USPS National Educational Fund Honor Roll for 2021 with a contribution 193% participation. Thanks to everyone who has contributed.

In last month's edition, I asked for volunteers to assume duty with our two most important public facing duties. My phone has not been ringing off the hook; I'm hoping folks are too busy getting out on the water to bravely step forward. The first position is Basic Boating Chairperson. In a nutshell, the duties include arranging for instructors, announcing scheduled course dates, enrolling

students, and facilitating either Zoom or in-person classes. A lot of the work is done via HQ800, a simple tool accessible via the web. Interested folks may call me, our Squadron Education Officer (Lt/C Bentley Rickmers, S), or LT Brenda Williamson, AP. This is a vital position as ABC3 is the gateway course into membership for just about anybody who has joined USPS. Since we usually start up classes in the early Fall, we really need to start the transition earlier rather than later.

The other position is Assistant VSC chairperson. We anticipate this position to ultimately lead to Chairperson status. The VSC Chairperson coordinates with the Vessel Safety Examiners (VSE) to meet with and complete vessel safety checks (VSC) for members and the public at large. Duties also include entering completed VSCs into the USPS database. This is a public facing job, and another vital position where our examiners introduce the public to our club. LT Sue Walker, S would share the duties for a period of time.

Big events are upcoming. First up is the TPS 2021 Cruise starting at Poulsbo on July 23, then Port Ludlow, Port Townsend (Hudson Point Marina), Pleasant Harbor, Kingston, and Brownsville, with the cruise ending on Sunday, August 8. Reservations are made and I have started to notify marinas that we were not able to fill all 12 slips per port. If you did not sign up because you didn't know whether or not you could attend, and now know you can, call me (253-948-6101) to see if we can fit you into the roster.

The traditional Sharps' place Salmon Bake is back! Mark your calendars for September 11 at 11:00 AM at the Sharps home. Bring a dish to share. I'll provide more details, such as the address in a later edition.

The D16 Fall Conference date is set for 9 October 2021. It will be held virtually.

I am planning on the Past Commanders' BBQ being an in-person event September 28 at Day Island Yacht Club. Plan to attend, bring a side dish to share. Remember that we no longer have bartenders so the event will be BYOB. There is no program, but plan to tell us what kind of classes you'd like to attend and which ports you want to visit in the 2022 rendezvous schedule. 

How you can have more fun out on the water.

While we are out boating or even just down on a dock, you can simply take a picture of an Aid to Navigation (ATON) with your phone. All you need to do is send me an EMAIL with the picture and location of the ATON. I will submit the report to the national safety committee for you. If you and your significant other are together then both of get credit. You then will get points for the ATON and hours toward your merit mark. How simple is that. Just another way to have fun and do community service.

How to report an Aid to Navigation.

The following are unique features and reporting actions for "ATON Inspections":

- 1) A photo is required! You can simply do a "drive by" visual inspection of each ATON and report the ATON's location coordinates.
- 2) No limit on number of ATONs submitted per report for credit.
- 3) Optionally can work with the responsible waterway agency and with the Coop Charting Committee for approval of a tailored inspection program.
- 4) Inspection ATONs are listed in an Excel or pdf file along with Chart # (if available), name/location of waterway, ATON numbers, coordinates, and condition of each ATON
- 5) Upload the ATON list file on the 1st Report Page of the Nautical Report Form using the "Upload Forms / Photos" button.
- 6) Check the Jump to Last Page box and then complete and submit your report

The squadron gets credit, you get credit, and you get hours toward a merit mark. So, why not participate in the Nautical Reporting Program. There are other ways to participate in the program by reporting bridges and marinas. For more information on these programs, please give me a call.



On June 17, 2021, the President signed into federal law the holiday Juneteenth National Independence Day Act. The date of the holiday is June 19th. Juneteenth National Independence Day Act commemorates the emancipation of African-American slaves. Months later, the 13th Amendment was ratified, abolishing slavery in the final four Border States that had not been subjected to President Abraham Lincoln's order. There has not been a federal holiday since 1983 when Congress passed the King Day Bill. The law creating the federal holiday in King's name went into effect in 1986.

On January 1, 1863, Abraham Lincoln issued his Emancipation Proclamation freeing enslaved people in United States. The nation was in the midst of the Civil War, and Southern states did not abide by the decree. Even after the South surrendered on April 9, 1865, it took the news some time to reach outlying states such as Texas. Federal troops were also needed to enforce the emancipation. People did not want to give up their slaves. June 19, 1865, U.S. Major General Gordon Granger and 2,000 troops landed in Galveston, Texas and marched through the streets reading Granger's newly issued General Order No.3. General Order No.3 served as an announcement of the end of slavery in accordance with Lincoln's 1863 Emancipation Proclamation. At the time, there were just over 1,000 enslaved people in the city.

Annual celebrations of the event began the very next year in Galveston, with a local paper recording eight hundred to thousand men, women and children took part in the celebration at which the Emancipation Proclamation was read. In decades since, Juneteenth celebrations have spread across the U.S. Now the Juneteenth National Independence Day Act has been officially sanctioned by the U.S. Government creating a new federal holiday. If you celebrate this holiday, of course is a personal choice. Just as it's a personal choice which holidays, I celebrate. Celebrate or not, at least you have an understanding of the reason behind Juneteenth. Stay safe out there and welcome to July.


