Recreational Boating Association of Washington (RBAW)

This report is published with permission of Past Commodore Day Island Yacht Club Chuck Gay. These reports will keep us updated on the current Washington legislation regarding area boaters.

May 2019 RBAW Report for DIYC

Overall, the 2019 Session will go into the books as a fairly positive one for recreational boating, though the Legislature made only incremental progress on the derelict vessel removal front.

Strong support for funding enhancements to the Derelict Vessel Removal Program (DVRP) and increased use of the Vessel Turn-In Incentive Program: The 2019 Legislature gets a mixed review here. We had hoped for a \$5 million Capital Budget allocation to help the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) address a backlog of removing 14 large vessels (100 feet long or more) from our state's waters. The Senate allocated \$5 million in its version of the Capital Budget, while the House mark was just \$1 million. The allocation in the final budget is \$2.5 million.

Support consensus recommendations from the Southern Resident Killer Whale (SRKW) Task Force, while opposing a \$10 fee 'opt-out' fee on boaters and any 'no-go' zone that is not imposed on all vessels: We should feel pretty good about the way the SRKW legislation ended up. The big bill addressing vessels was Second Substitute Senate Bill 5577 (2SSB 5577), linked here:

The bill increases the distance 'bubble' that vessels must maintain when whales are present – from 200 yards to 300 yards. 5577 also calls for a 400-yard distance *behind* the SRKWs, and a go-slow requirement of 7 knots or less within one-half nautical mile of where the whales are present. It additionally establishes licensing requirements for whale-watching businesses and other types of vessels that take people on whale-watching excursions. A separate, RBAW-supported bill, SB 5918, calls for whale watching guidelines to be woven into the Washington State Parks boater-education curriculum (used for Boater Education Cards). The Governor will sign both 5577 and 5918 into law.

Enact 2019-21 Capital Budget with Robust Funding Allocations for Recreational Boating and Outdoor Recreation Grant Programs: The Legislature's 2019-21 Capital Budget (ESHB 1102) came out pretty well for us. It includes \$17.8 million for the Boating Facilities Program (BFP), \$2.6 million for Clean Vessel pump-out grants, and \$2.2 million for Boating Infrastructure Grants (BIG). It also includes \$85 million for the Washington Wildlife and Recreation Program (WWRP), which includes a water access category for non-motorized vessels; and \$6.6 million for the Aquatic Lands Enhancement Account, which is used to preserve and enhance waterfront areas.

Big Tent Outdoor Recreation Coalition/Outdoor Recreation Caucus: RBAW supports the "Big Tent" Outdoor Recreation Coalition and has also been very supportive of the Outdoor Recreation Caucus of legislators that meets each Thursday morning during the legislative sessions. A few procedural and substantive 'wins' for the Big Tent in 2019:

- The Legislature allocated \$1.5 million for the competitive-grant "No Child Left Inside" (NCLI) program which came back to life a few years ago through the efforts of the Big Tent and others;
- Big Tent hosted a successful March 14 reception that drew more than 50 attendees;

The Big Tent did a presentation (via President Peter Schrappen) on its brief history, objectives, and accomplishments, at one of the Outdoor Recreation Caucus meetings.

Road Usage Charge – Ensure There is a Plan for Accommodating Gas Tax-Related Funding Set-asides for recreational boating, off-road vehicle riding, and snowmobiling: RUC Members have established a 'hold harmless' approach. I should also note that the question of recognizing the needs of recreational boaters, off-road-vehicles, and snowmobilers came into play during the legislative session when the Senate considered Substitute Senate Bill 5791 on raising the gas tax. We were able to put together a strong testimony panel at the end of the Session that any gas tax *must* include the appropriate percentage of 'refunds' to dedicated accounts for boating, ORVs, and snowmobiles.

Regulatory -- No Discharge Zone (NDZ) Proposal by the Department of Ecology (DOE): RBAW and other members of the "Marine Alliance" strongly opposed the establishment of an NDZ covering the entirety of the Puget Sound basin. While the Puget Sound-wide NDZ has been *designated*, both legal challenges and U.S. Coast Guard enforcement concerns have left *implementation* in limbo.

Regulatory -- Adoption of a National Electric Code (NEC) Standard to Apply to Ground-Fault Leakage at Marina Docks: RBAW is pleased that both a recent State Labor & Industries (L&I) adoption of the 2017 NEC standards, and proposed federal standards, is resulting in an achievable outcome for marina operators while still providing electric shock drowning protections.

Regulatory -- Burlington Northern/Santa Fe Railr oad (BNSF) Plans to Replace Ballard Bridge along the Locks at Salmon Bay: RBAW and NMTA have participated in early meetings with BNSF, which is in the early design stages on a new railroad bridge to replace the current one at Salmon Bay.

Study of what to do with copper-bottomed paint used on vessels: A study of what to do to reduce the use of copper in paint and in water bodies was a part of HB 2634 passed in 2018. The study being done by the Department of Ecology will be completed by September 2019 and will lead to some recommendations for the 2020 Legislature. 2634 permanently exempted wooden boats from any copper-bottomed-paint phase-out.

Environmental Report

Troubled Trees in the Pacific Northwest

As I'm getting closer to working on a project involving a large fir tree, I decided it would be prudent to have the tree looked at by a professional arborist. I chose a local ISA (International Society of Arboriculture), Oualified Arborist. My concerns with the tree I have chosen were because during a recent windstorm, we had numerous fir trees of various sizes come down. One of those suspected had root rot. When the Arborist arrived, we went out to my project site, and he proceeded to note the condition of my tree, getting far back looking at the top, then back to the tree looking around at the stumps of older trees that had been cut long before we moved on the property. He picks out a stump, well-rotted and pulls a clump out of the center and observes the rotten wood through what looks to be a Jeweler's loop. After he studied the sample, he said he can tell a lot about the surrounding trees from the old stumps nearby. The example told him whether the stump was infected with a fungus. The fibers would show tiny red hairs "hyphae" if it were infected. Also, the annual growth rings would show signs of de lamination, and that's why it's called laminated root rot. His observation of the top of the tree or the canopy would most likely be thinning maybe even yellowing and crowning which the roots have advanced root damage. Good news, this big tall Fir appears to be healthy currently. Unfortunately, we have a couple of groups of trees that have strong signs laminated root rot and need to come down because of their proximity to our home and barn. This is typical around the North West with fir and hemlock. Our next step is to call a logger to remove the bad ones before the next big windstorm. If you are interested, you can get more information at Washington State University (Hortsense). If you have suspicions that your trees are sick, I have the number of a good Arborist. Of course, I was relieved that the tree I was planning to build a tree house is healthy and fungus free.

Coeur d'Alene "FUN @ THE LAKE" - October 2019

Technically, the USPS D/16 2019 Fall Conference runs just a day and a half - Friday evening and all day Saturday, 11-12 October. But the conference theme offers you an open invitation to extend your visit to Coeur d'Alene and explore some of the many ways to have "Fun @ the Lake."

Lake Coeur d'Alene is the second largest lake in Northern Idaho, running over 26 miles long with about 135 miles of shoreline. The lake was formed in a beautiful mountainous region some 12,000-15,000 years ago with the receding of the last continental ice cap. Today's shoreline is dotted with many parks, campgrounds, beaches, hiking trails, and recreational facilities (including over a dozen well-maintained boat launch facilities). Several companies offer watercraft rentals ranging from ski boats to pontoon boats to sailboats. For camera buffs, the photo opportunities are spectacular.

A special added opportunity on Friday morning will be a guided tour of Farragut State Park and its museum at nearby Bayview on Lake Pend Oreille. When built in 1942, Farragut was the second largest naval training station in the world, behind only the Great Lakes Naval Training Station near Chicago. Over 293,000 sailors received their basic training at Farragut during its 30 months of operation. In 1945 the base served as a prisoner-of-war camp. The Friday morning tour (Oct. 11) offers a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for conference attendees to re-explore this important phase of American history. Reservations are required - visit the D/16 website and click on "2019 Fall Conference" for details.

Available Friday afternoon will be guided tours of the famous Hagadone Marine Center on Lake Coeur d'Alene and its wooden boat factory. Reservation details for these tours are posted on the D/16 2019 Fall Conference website. Also, as detailed on the conference registration form, Friday evening offers a two-hour lake cruise with drinks and appetizers.

Apart from the conference, there are many nearby shopping venues and countless other recreational opportunities in the Greater Spokane-Coeur d'Alene metro area. A few simple web searches will whet your appetite to add a few days of vacation before and/or after the conference weekend for more "Fun @ the Lake."

Conference headquarters will be at the world-famous Coeur d'Alene Resort. The registration form for the conference is posted on the D/16 website. To get conference-rate hotel prices, you are urged to get your room reservations early - no later than September 1, 2019. Please be sure to register directly with The Coeur d'Alene Resort (call toll-free to at 855-703-4648) so that D/16 gets credit against its room-night guarantee. (We do not get credit against the guarantee for any reservations made through Expedia.com or hotels.com or similar sites.) To help encourage you to spend some extra time for more "Fun @ the Lake," the Coeur d'Alene Resort has agreed to extend the D/16 conference room prices for three days before and three days after the conference based upon availability.




