

Ureetings from your Commander!

The Change of Watch is over, and my job has begun to help each of you as members of Tacoma Power Squadron, America's Boating Club of Tacoma & South Puget Sound. As a retired Army guy, I learned that the Commander is responsible for everything that the command does or fails to do. Luckily, as we are all volunteers, we can't really fail. We'll do what we can to the best of our ability and that is always better than doing nothing.

Cdr Stan Wolfe, SN-CN For my first article, I'm going to provide a brief background to include why I'm in the Power Squadron. I'll finish up by discussing some near-term goals and projects with which the Squadron is involved. It might be that you may find something that interests you if you are not already involved.

I've been boating in Puget Sound since I was 15 years old. Being a military brat and subsequently a career Army officer, assignments took me away from the region many years. Returning to the Northwest in 1992, I soon returned to boating with my wife, Deb, and our son, Robbie. As most folks seem to do, we started with a small 15-foot outboard cathedral-hulled boat. Great lake boat, not so much out on Puget Sound. Two-foot-itis crept up on us and we went to an 18-footer, then a couple of upper-20s express cruisers. The first express cruiser delivery was confidence shaking what with blowing wind, rain, darkness, and those new-fangled trim tab thingies that didn't seem to work right. After jamming the boat into our slip, I thought to myself, "I got to get some training."

After a little Googling, filling out a contact form, I was hooked up with either the electric company or a boating safety organization, United States Power Squadrons. After eight or nine weeks of class, reading all the material, attending the lectures, answering the end of chapter quizzes, and passing the exam, my son and I received our certification of completion. At this point I was only a slightly safer boater. The years of practice, taking a lot more classes, listening to the dockside war stories at rendezvous, and finally getting some hands-on training via the Boat Operator Certification program has made me a better, much safer boater. I'm quite comfortable in our twin-engined Bayliner 3288, GreyWolfes' - we love it!

So much for the past - what lies ahead? First, I hope we can resume some familiar patterns with face-to-face classes. I'm not adverse continuing Zoom-based training as it is another tool in our training delivery collection. It's just nice to get face time with students. Face time with each other is another goal. We can start with the Memorial Day rendezvous in Swantown. Please plan to attend and make your reservation directly with the marina. I planned a wonderful cruise for 2020 but had to reschedule. So, we'll be doing six ports of call on the Kitsap and Olympic peninsula starting July 23 through August 8. Call me to join up; we are at about 50% occupancy so there is still plenty of room, but the clock is ticking.

Boaters and paddlers urged to wear life jackets on cold water (From Washington State Parks and Rec)

During spring, the air warms but Washington's waterways remain cold. Safety officials are reminding boaters and paddlers that wearing a life jacket is key for cold-water safety.

While people are encouraged to always wear a life jacket no matter the water temperature or season, public safety officials stress that wearing a life jacket – not just having it on the boat – significantly increases the chances of surviving an unexpected fall into cold water.

The shock of falling into cold water triggers a gasp reflex, which more than likely means inhaling water. Wearing a life jacket gives you a fighting chance to get your head above water, stay calm and call for help.

Despite recent warmer weather, water temperatures statewide are still below 60 degrees – cold enough to cause the gasp reflex and incapacitate even strong swimmers in less than one minute.

Before the first launch of the season, boaters and paddlers are also reminded to review <u>boating regulations</u> and <u>get</u> <u>educated</u>, inspect their watercraft and gear, verify vessels are <u>properly equipped</u> and always wear a life jacket while out on the water.





- New ECOS Guidance from the Coast Guard: Beginning April 1, 2021, boats under 26 feet manufactured after 2018 with a 3 hp or larger motor are required to have the engine cut-off switch installed by the manufacturer, and users are required to use it when operating over displacement speed and without an enclosed cabin. This is part of the Safety Vessel Check (pass/fail).




