So now is the time I must pass on important information received from National. You need to keep informed on what is proposed, suggested and recommended by the committees that affect our squadron. Here is the latest from the AD HOC Committee on Reorganization.

COMMANDER

The document is a 11-page status report which I won't try to print all of the report but here are the suggested recommendations. I will have the report if anyone wants to see the details.

•	Simplify Clubs as described in proposed bylaw changes.
•	Allow Clubs to decide the value, and future, of their District including potentials for continuing as is, merging, or dissolution.
•	Implement electronic voting for all National meetings to allow for the direct participation in decision-making by Clubs (see Section 2.5)
•	Focus National Departments and Committees on direct support of Clubs & Members. Initial
	focus should be to enhance Education, Boating & Social events, Marketing & Membership, and overall Communication.
•	Ensure that each National Department and Committee conducts the formal self-evaluation process recommended in this report (Section 3.2) to improve services to Clubs.
•	Develop a formal and comprehensive communications strategy and plan between National and Clubs.
•	Implement a formal program to improve services, operational effectiveness, and efficient use of scarce resources for all National Departments and Committees based on the recommendations in this report.
•	Ensure that all National Departments and Committees develop a succession plan.
•	Enable online Member access to Club events across our organization including organization, registration, and participation (<i>"SEAS</i> The Day" – Squadron Education & Activity Scheduler)

Currently we have two classes going on, Engine Maintenance at Tacoma Yacht Club on Thursdays and Piloting on Mondays. We will have Advanced Piloting (Advanced Marine Navigation) starting in March. If you have taken Piloting and want to take this course sign up online on the National USPS website.

I hope to have a Cruise Planning Course in January if there is enough interest, so please let me know if you are interested!

Ever dream of cruising to exotic destinations, chartering in foreign waters, or gunk holing in quiet backwaters? Learn what you need to confidently plan your boat trip and go cruising.

Gain the self-reliance and practical skills needed to explore ports and coves for a weekend or weeks at a time. Take Cruising and Cruise Planning and join your fellow boaters for raft-ups and rendezvous around the sound or anywhere. What's included?

- Cruise preparation and planning
- Cruising boats and equipment
- Engines and electrical systems
- Safety gear and equipment
- Crew selection, training, and comfort
- Provisioning and meal planning
- Communications
- Navigation
- Anchoring and mooring
- Weather information sources and uses
- Storm watches, warnings, and advisories
- Chartering
- Cruising outside the United States
- Emergencies

Andy Temple has agreed to teach Radar. This is a great class for anyone that has radar or plans to get it. Dates and place to be determined. Please let me know if you are interested in this course. I know of one person already!

This course was developed by Canadian Power and Sail Squadrons and is up to date for Radar technologies available now and into the near future. The course covers the different types of Radar equipment, their capabilities and limitations, as well as their features and how they apply to students' needs. It covers what you need to know about Radar, from how and where to mount the antenna to how to interpret the displays, so you can use your Radar for collision avoidance and for navigational purposes. Students attending this course should have completed America's Boating Course (or another NASBLA-approved boating safety course), preferably have completed Marine Navigation and Advanced Marine Navigation (currently Piloting and Advanced Piloting) and have boating experience.

Also, we will be having the basic boating course after the first of the year.

Nominating Committee Status Report as of October 26, 2022.

I'm executing my plan to fill the slate for the next watch which starts the fourth Tuesday in April, 2023. First, I'd like to thank all those who have served this year as your efforts have contributed to our very active, productive club. After I determine which positions need to be filled, I will be calling the general membership asking for folks to step up and volunteer. So far, my calls to current position holders have been encouraging, but there are some positions that will need new volunteers.

Perhaps the most important role to be filled is that of Administrative Officer. I rank that as number one because it is traditionally the route to command in the third year. The Administrative Officer handles the internal functions of the Squadron and gets the opportunity to learn more about how the club and the US Power Squadron operates.

I'll be asking for someone to serve as Basic Boating Chairperson. Lt/C Bentley Rickmers, S has been running this segment of our education program, in addition to her other duties as Squadron Education Officer. Bentley would like to hand over day-to-day planning and execution to a volunteer who likes to work with the public. The Basic Boating Chairperson will register classes then sign up students on the USPS webpage, coordinate with instructors to determine the best dates and with venues to determine the location of classes. The basic boating course (ABC3) usually consists of four two-hour evening classes of instruction followed by a one evening exam. Each class is lead by a dedicated instructor. The ABC Chairperson usually administers the exam, but Squadron members usually volunteer to help proctor and grade the exam. This course is our club's introduction to the public and potential new members. The duties of the Basic Boating Chairperson are not overly complex and Bentley will certainly be happy to show the ropes to the new chairperson. Please consider this as a vital and necessary contribution you can make.

I'll mention a couple of other jobs in passing but the list of unfilled positions is a bit longer.

We would like to have a Boating Activities Chairperson. Rendezvous attendance took a major hit during COVID and since then we have had several members leave boating due to age or injury. The boating activities chairperson solicits preferred locations and dates, coordinates with marinas and manages the cruise fund. We typically rendezvous once a month February - October at marinas ranging from Olympia to Kingston. There is talk of reducing the number of rendezvous but encourage more attendance at those we do conduct. A robust schedule with fun activities for our newer members would increase the vitality of our club.

The other job for which I would like to see new members participate is that of Executive Board Member-at-Large. We will probably have a couple of vacancies and folks filling these positions are not on the bridge. They provide input to decisions about the club's direction and plans for activities. This requires attending one executive session a month, normally the second Tuesday, September through May. It is a great way to learn while participating.

When you get the call, run - not from the request but rather toward the challenge!
