All I can say is "Thank you!" to all who make this squadron so great. You are the best!





At a general meeting several months ago I was asked to lead off our meeting as usual with the Pledge of Allegiance right after the Invocation. I was of course honored and proceeded with the pledge. Afterward, a member approached me and told me I was saying the pledge wrong. I thanked him and asked just how I was saying it wrong. He told me I wasn't the only one and that most people who grew up reciting the Pledge of Allegiance in school as a child still say it the same way now as they did then (the way they were taught). I thanked him and went on my way in the meeting. Several months have passed by now and after some research and looking up the code from the United States flag code, I find he was very much correct. I thought I would pass it along to you. The Pledge of Allegiance written by Francis Bellamy, a Baptist Minister and writer for The Youth's Companion, the pledge has changed several times over the years. Below you can see the evolution of the "Pledge of Allegiance."

1892

"I pledge allegiance to my flag and the Republic for which it stands, one nation, indivisible, with liberty and Justice for all"

1892

1923

"I pledge allegiance to the Flag of the United States and to the Republic for which it stands, one Nation indivisible, with liberty and justice for all"

1924


"I pledge allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America and to the Republic for which it stands, one Nation indivisible, with liberty and justice for all"

1954

"I pledge allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America and to the Republic for which it stands, one Nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all"

As you can see in the latest version from 1954, the words "under God" were added to the pledge and you will also notice that there is no comma after one Nation. So you would not pause one Nation, under God, just said as one Nation under God. The original Bellamy salute, first described in 1892 by Francis Bellamy, who authored the original Pledge, began with a military salute, and after reciting the words "to the flag," the arm was extended toward the flag. During WWII the military style salute was deleted as it resembled a Nazi salute and the right hand placed over the heart instead.

That Member was Denny McHugo, Past Commander of the Olympia Sail and Power Squadron. Although Denny has passed on in recent weeks, I will always remember him for the thoughtful and informative conversation we had that day. Probably good solid information for someone like myself who is the current District 16 Flag Lt.

The Seamanship class will have completed their exam on March 15th. Many of the Seamanship Class students are taking the Piloting Class or the Engine Maintenance Class starting March 20th and March 22nd respectively. We have some students that are taking both classes! Wow, that's great! We wish to thank Cdr Lance Williamson for a job very well done for instructing the Seamanship Class.

After meetings with Gene Anderson with Pt. Defiance Boat House, we are planning to teach a Paddle Smart Seminar (approximately 2 hours) to prospective Pt. Defiance customers who wish to go out with paddle craft. We would do a session in May, June and July. The dates and details are being worked out as this message is being written, and will be announced as soon as that's done.

What we need from our membership are some volunteers to assist in teaching the seminars. Our National Power Squadrons Organization provides the books and handouts. The instructor's materials provided make doing this seminar relatively easy to do, and you don't need to be a paddle boater to present the class. We would do the classroom part of the instruction, using the power point slides and materials. This may be followed with park staff conducting some "hands on" demonstrations for the students at Owen's Beach.

There will be an ABC Class at the Pt. Defiance Boat House starting on Wednesday May 03, 2017 running for 5 weeks. This class is open to anyone interested in attending. There is a tentative plan to do another ABC Class in early June as well. The exact dates will be determined soon. Our member's help is always appreciated for these classes.


It's not too early to give some thought to classes that we could plan for next fall, that would interest you. Let me know your desires, since I keep tabs on these requests.

It came out at the recent District 16 Conference, that many of our members were not aware that seasoned members can do on the water demonstrations and instruction on a member's boat. The requirements are that the boat have a current Vessel Safety Check and decal, and that the time and date of the on the water demonstration be approved by the Squadron Executive Board and that approval be included in the board meeting minutes. If you would like to hone your talents at close quarters boat handling, let me know, and we can put something together. The United States Power Squadrons has liability insurance that covers these approved activities. Give me a call, or send an Email, and I will respond.

February 24 - 26, 2017




Shortly before 5 p.m. on Jan. 19, the outgoing U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Region X Director signed a document that could set the stage for an NDZ designation – namely, confirming (*in contrast with on-the-ground realities*) that the Department of Ecology has adequate commercial pump-out facilities to allow the designation to go forward. It is fair to say that the incoming EPA leadership will have a very different view of the need for an NDZ.

Both the Senate and House Natural Resources committees have held hearings on these RBAW-supported bills to augment funding for the Department of Fish and Wildlife's Aquatic Invasive Species enforcement and education programs. The bills are temporarily stuck due to strong opposition from commercial vessel groups and Ports.

We recently learned of a pending U.S. Coast Guard rule-making change that will cause a significant upheaval for all those who sell, trade, register, or re-register vessels. The rule-making would change a longtime practice of having manufacturer-designated Hull Identification Numbers (HINs) be the numbers that are recorded with all vessel transactions, registrations, sales, and trade-ins.

– **SB 5442/HB 1604; HB 1605; SB 5552:** Hearings have already occurred or are scheduled on all these bills, which we at RBAW support. **5442/1604** repeals some outdated language in the Boater Education Card statutes and flexes up the use of the funds for State Parks. **HB 1605** allows law enforcement – as a last resort – to impound vessels when operators are impaired. **SB 5552** would exempt flare guns used by boaters from having to go through a “weapons” background check (*classic ‘law of unintended consequences!’*).

Retaining Boating Facilities Program (BFP) funding in the Capital Budget: We have to be vigilant, as the BFP will have \$17.166 million in it for 2017-19 due to new gas tax proceeds coming into the State Treasury as a result of the 2015 “Connecting Washington” package. That funding level makes the program a potential ‘target’ given severe Capital Budget funding pressures

Governor-requests bills to eliminate or change a series of ‘tax preferences’ – HB 1549/SB 5112: These bills have not yet had a hearing and we don’t expect them to receive one for quite awhile. A section of **1549/5112** would limit the current vehicle and vessel trade-in sales tax exemption to an exemption only on the first \$10,000 in sales value. We join NMTA in opposing this.
