EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT



In 1941 a Navy cook served on the Battleship West Virginia stationed at Pearl Harbor. We all know what happened on the 7th of December the 1941. The Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor damaging 19 vessels (half sunk) and killing about 2,400 people. Doris Miller was serving as a US Navy cook Third Class when the attack happened. Doris Miller Third Class was the first African American to receive the Navy Cross, an award one step below the Medal of Honor.

Miller was a native of Waco, Texas, born on 12 October 1919 to Connery and Henrietta Miller. They named him Doris before he was born because they thought he was going to be a girl. I guess they did not want to change the name after he was born a boy. Miller enlisted as a Mess Attendant Third Class in September 1939. In those days that was one of the very few jobs an African American Sailor could have. After completing training and a short stay on an ammo ship, he was transferred to the Colorado-Class Battleship, the West Virginia. He started boxing on the West Virginia and became the heavyweight champion of the ship. On 7 December 1941 after serving breakfast and starting his rounds of collecting laundry, Japanese planes attacked. The West Virginia was hit with several torpedos from torpedo bombers. Miller helped with causalities and manned an anti-aircraft gun which he was not allowed to be trained on. He shot down between 4 and 6 enemy planes (we will call it 5, close enough for government work) that day, and helped with moving injured Sailors to safety. For his selfless service and bravery, he earned the Navy Cross.

On 15 May 1943 Miller was assigned to the Puget Sound Navy Yard in Bremerton Washington. He was stationed on a newly constructed Escort Carrier, the USS Liscome Bay. The USS Liscome duty was to escort convoys and conduct other amphibious operations. The USS Liscome Bay conducted training operations in Hawaii to prepare for combat operations with the Northern Task Force. 10 November 1943 the USS Liscome left Pearl Harbor and joined the Northern Task Force, Group 52, for combat operations. The USS Liscome fought in the Battle of Makin on 20 November 1943. After Makin was captured by the American forces and on Thanksgiving eve, the USS Liscome Bay cruised by Butaritari. Right before dawn a Japanese submarine sank the USS Liscome Bay. Two-thirds of the crew was presumed Killed in Action (KIA) and Miller was one of them.



EDUCATIONAL DEPARTMENT



America's Boating Club of Tacoma and South Puget Sound (Tacoma Power Squadron) has two upcoming classes.

RADAR for Boaters starts February 9th at Tacoma Yacht Club at 7 pm and runs for 6 weeks on Thursdays. RADAR is an essential tool for navigation and collision avoidance. The course covers the different types of radar equipment, their capabilities, and limitations, as well as their features and how they apply to boaters' needs. Price of this course is \$80 for members of

America's Boating Club and \$125 for non-members.

Students attending this course should have completed a basic boating course such as America's Boating Course and <u>Marine Navigation</u> (Piloting) and have boating experience. <u>Radar for Boaters</u> is a required course for BOC-Offshore Navigation certification.

Advanced Piloting (Advanced Navigation) starts March 13 via Zoom for 8 weeks on Tuesdays. First class is on Monday at Day Island Yacht Club in person. Cost for members of America's Boating Club is \$70 non-members \$110. Do you want to navigate unfamiliar waters in limited visibility or take an extended cruise with confidence? Learn to use manual navigation, radar, chart plotters, AIS, and other electronic tools in a variety of coastal tide, current and wind conditions. Learn course planning, extended cruise navigation, hazard and collision avoidance, and navigational aids. Our experienced instructors and extensive knowledge base make you a better captain.

What's included?

- Advanced positioning techniques, such as advancing a line of position to obtain a running fix
- Use of a variety of electronic tools: radar, depth sounders, autopilots, chart plotters, laptop computer software, and more
- Hazard avoidance techniques using electronics (e.g., avoidance waypoints or safety zones in GPS)
- Collision avoidance using radar, GPS, and AIS
- Working with the tide and current data to determine clearances, depth of water, and effects of current
- Piloting in various wind and current conditions
- Simple skills for checking that one is on course




