As the year comes to a close and the changes in leadership in our Squadron, perhaps it is a good time to give you some information on how I came to be in the Tacoma Power Squadron.

Lt/C Bob Hays,

My wife Patty and I have been boating since we met over 40 years ago. Her family had always been boaters and I was introduced to the water and boats as a child, but never got to actively boat until I met Patty.

We spent many years on various sailboats, from ten feet to 26 feet. Then in 1989 we bought a home built 26' sailing catamaran, and brought it from Canada to Lake Washington. We learned about sailing a catamaran, and a couple of years later we moved aboard and lived on Lightyears for the next five years. Time was spent moving the boat to salt water, and cruising Puget Sound, the San Juans and Canada.

In 1999 I retired after 25 years in the fire department, we sold our catamaran and moved to another one on the east coast. For the next five years we averaged 3,000 miles a year repeatedly traveling the east coast, from the Chesapeake, to all points to Florida, the Keys and the Bahamas.

2005, brought us back to Washington, moved to land living and transitioned to power boats. It was at this time that Patty and I fulfilled the requirements to get our master's licenses.

In the past ten years we have continued to power boat and now enjoy our 26' Nordic Tug, which is comfortable for two and will fit almost anywhere. Also during this time I have captained boats on the East Coast, Alaska, and Washington.

As far as volunteer organizations and boating, I joined the US Coast Guard Auxiliary in 1998 and was active until 2021 when I retired. While I enjoyed the Auxiliary and what we could do to help and educate boaters, being attached to the government required a lot of required repeated training and paperwork. So, we left the Auxiliary and joined the US Power Squadron to continue to learn, share and have fun.

While these two organizations have a similar mission, there are a lot of differences. With your help and patience I will learn these new ropes.

I share with you what I used to share with every new fire crew I was assigned to as their officer... If I am doing something wrong, or you know a way that I can do it better, let me know. Because if you don't say something, it will probably not change. I am striving to do the best I can for all involved, not to make things worse. I appreciate all you can do to help me help you.

Insurance Coverage Update

From Gary L. Baker, D16 Executive Officer

Here is the latest information on the insurance situation:

- 1. A policy of general liability and officers and directors insurance for squadrons, clubs and districts went into effect on December 2. A copy of the policy is not available but will be posted on the national website when received. The policy will state any coverage exclusions.
- 2. There is currently <u>no coverage</u> for on-the-water, cooperative charting, and vessel safety checks activities; but the national officers expect to obtain that coverage by the end of December. They will let us know when that happens.
- 3. There will be <u>no coverage</u> for fundraising activities and holiday parties in third party venues, but ABC|USPS will make available a website portal for districts, squadrons and clubs to purchase event coverage for those activities. The portal is not yet available.
- 4. ABC|USPS will later advise us how to obtain a Certificate of Liability Insurance Coverage to provide to a municipality as a requirement to use their facilities.


