


That's all for now. Stay tuned, stay safe, engage and do some boating!

Happy New Year! Welcome to 2024! With a new year comes new classes!

ABC, America's Boating Course, will begin January 8 at Day Island Yacht Club, 7-9 pm for 4 classes plus the night of the exam. Passing this course qualifies you for the Washington State Boater's Card.

Taking a boating class reduces your risk of accidents and injuries, saves you money on boat insurance.

America's Boating Course is the most comprehensive, single source, in-person boating course available to give you the skills you need to enjoy your time on the water and boat with confidence. Available in both English and Spanish, our boater safety class meets most states' certification requirements.

#### What You'll Learn:

- Information about your State Boating Laws, regulations, boat registration, and licensing.
- Required boating safety equipment.
- Dos and Don'ts of boating safely
- Practical Knowledge of navigation and rules of the road
- How to handle medical emergencies onboard and mechanical problems on the water








## America's Boating Channel<sup>™</sup> Understanding Life Jacket Labels

Let's start the year by getting our life jackets ready for the 2024 boating season. If you cleaned and inspected your life jackets before storing them for winter storage, you should know how many need to be replaced. Which brings us to



our topic of life jacket labels. You may be unaware of the new labeling system if you have not purchased a life jacket recently. Type I, II, III and IV labeling was removed by the U.S. Coast Guard from the Code of Federal Regulations in 2014, but it is taking several years for the legacy designations to be phased out.



To help boaters understand the current labeling system, Season Four of America's Boating Channel offers the video "<u>Life Jacket Labels</u>" in which you are introduced to the simplified labels that contain less writing and more icons.

Regardless of your age or experience level, data shows that life jackets save lives. So don't hesitate to replace older life jackets. America's Boating Channel also produced a sequel entitled "New Label Benefits" that covers the advantages of the new life jacket labeling system. In this video, viewers learn how to interpret label icons. Also featured are tips for selecting the right life jacket for your intended on-the-water activity.

In addition to YouTube, these professionally produced high-definition safe boating and boater education videos are available via the America's Boating Channel free, on-demand app on Apple TV, Roku or FireTV. America's Boating Channel™ is produced by the United States Power Squadrons® (USPS) under a grant from the Sport Fish Restoration and Boating Trust Fund administered by the U.S. Coast Guard.

A flight of nine new Inlet Drone Videos (IDVs) have been approved for public release by the U.S. Coast Guard. IDVs combine aerial video footage and 3D chart animations to help recreational boaters plan their first sorties through challenging and dangerous U.S. waterway entrances. Closed-captioned streaming versions of these videos will be available the first week of January at https://www.youtube.com/playlist?list=PLgIbejlMU2Hd\_lYJGtyK6udYt4t-4zFSz. Eight of the new IDVs are available now for download from https://drive.google.com/drive/folders/1DsuI\_dzAx-oZTISpmeQ9jYhxYGs6lvUd, with the ninth to be added in the near future.

America's Boating Channel was honored with the 2023 Go Global Award for Maritime Services. The press release is available here.

You also may want to remind your members, and especially your Educational Officers, that since America's Boating Channel's launch, all of its videos have been available to USPS members to screen and download for free at bit.ly/USPSABC. This is very convenient for instructors who want to use these videos in the classroom without the need for an internet connection


