
# COMMANDER

- demonstrate creating a learning plan using slide(s) from ABC3 material,
- demonstrate developing a plan from an idea or interest of an instructor, and
- use a new rubric to review and make comments on a teaching plan.



Greetings fellow members of America's Boating Club of Tacoma and South Puget Sound!

Lt/C Stan Wolfe, SN-CN Last month I wrote about a few positions that are important to our club's operation but were vacant. The positions were Boating Activities Chair, Property Officer, and Historian. Since that article appeared about a month ago, I've noticed my phone is not ringing off the hook with folks offering to take on these jobs.

I attended the District 16 Rendezvous, the dinner at least, but not by boat. The issue wasn't the fact that our boat was hit last year, but that one of our dogs has mobility issues so walking all the way up the dock to the park without an accident makes it difficult on us. I noted that only 12 boats attended, two from Tacoma. That means that some squadrons had no boat representation at all. It's a shame. Beside the camaraderie, Poulsbo is a great boating destination. Food, shops, walks along the boardwalk provide plenty of entertainment. The District rendezvous resembles our club's rendezvous attendance. With the overall decline in rendezvous attendance, and the lack of a Boating Activities Chairman, the future of rendezvous in general is at risk. We have about 60 boats in the club, but have older members, not in the best of health, and attendance has been decreasing for years. I'm hoping a volunteer will step up and provide a pathway for enthusiasm that revitalizes this major part of the Power Squadron mission. Give me a call.

My other theme last month was the effort to urge folks to get together for boating activities. In that vein, we are conducting a rendezvous at Des Moines Marina August 18-20. You've seen the email blasts and we have had enough responses to meet the fleet minimum required to receive a great deal. As of this writing there are six boats signed up to attend. The hosts, Nancy and Geoff Ringstad, are putting together some activities and a nifty breakfast on Saturday morning. The marina is offering the first night moorage of \$25 to include power regardless of boat length. Subsequent nights are at the regular seasonal rate of \$1.00/foot (LOA). If planning to attend and have not already done so, contact me or the hosts as soon as possible as the first night deal requires your boat to be listed on the moorage plan.

Deb and I have been boating. My brother visited from Wichita and wanted to go on a boat ride. The last time he visited was in December 2004 so this time we have a bigger boat and better weather. We took him to... wait for it, yup, Poulsbo! Since we went mid-week, we were able to moor very close to the head of the dock thus giving the lame pup a better chance of making the park before getting down to business. We were mostly successful. It was a one-nighter, so we ate dinner at Tizzleys and breakfast at Green Light Diner; both great meals. We hit most of the shops in town, and spent some time in Long Ship Marine. The weather and the boat ride to and from were fantastic.

Deb and I just returned from Kingston, a two-night stay. For the first time ever, we were able to take part in reciprocal moorage at Kingston as members of Tacoma Yacht Club. Port of Kingston changed their reciprocal method from a couple of dedicated slips to a roster based on monthly usage, much like Port Orchard. We would have stayed longer but the tread on the ramp was too rough for the dogs. Kingston is another great place to visit, but there is some sad news. The Red Apple market has been closed down since last October, to be replaced by a Grocery Outlet and Bargain Market this coming September. That was a bummer, but the crepe place was still there and as delicious as ever. The weather was gorgeous, the run up and back was pleasant. With both of us retired, we have discovered several joys of mid-week boating such as less wakes and more availability of mooring. We are looking for like minded boaters and have found a few, so if you are planning a weekday trip, send us an email and if the old calendar is open, we'll give you a call.

# America's Boating Channel Reminder: Knowledge of the Navigation Rules Helps Prevent Boating Accidents

As we prepare to celebrate July Fourth, don't forget that knowledge of the rules of navigation helps prevent boating accidents. If you need a refresher before getting out on the water, you can access an invaluable library of videos produced by America's Boating Channel. These videos are available to USPS members to view and download for free at <a href="bit.ly/USPSABC">bit.ly/USPSABC</a>. There is an index to help you find exactly what you need, which is very convenient for instructors who want to use these videos in the classroom without the need for an internet connection.




For example, Season Four's <u>"Behavioral Consequences"</u> (<a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=yWq-jshx8yU&t=44s">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=yWq-jshx8yU&t=44s</a>) video covers the importance to recreational boat operators of having a working knowledge of the navigation rules. Viewers learn about the dangers of not following the rules of the road. Also featured are tips for responsible boating. Boating responsibly can lead to lasting memories, while bad boating behaviors can cause issues ranging from mere embarrassment to major catastrophe.



America's Boating Channel<sup>TM</sup> produced a sequel to this video in Season Five titled "Collision Avoidance" (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=7cXv6s7wqjE&t=1s), which covers the most basic and essential navigation rules. Viewers learn how to determine stand-on and give-way vessels in various circumstances. It also features tips for steering clear of potentially dangerous situations. For example, at night not using navigation lights or not learning

how to interpret them can lead to incidents with more serious outcomes than during the day. Again, these two videos are good refreshers before visiting your local waterway at a time of year when it will be most crowded.

### Des Moines Rendezvous August 18 - 20, 2023

Tacoma Power Squadron (aka America's Boating Club of Tacoma and South Puget Sound) will rendezvous at Des Moines Marina the weekend of August 18-20, 2023. We are trying to flesh out the schedule of activities and get our boat owning members out on the water. We need your commitment to attend not later than July 6, 2023.

#### There is lots to do:

Boaters can fuel up, pump out, or stop by for one or both nights on their way to somewhere else.

Tentative plan and times to be based on number of boats attending:

Friday - Arrive and gather for a dutch treat dinner out at Anthony's (5:30ish PM).

Saturday - Breakfast with egg wraps & fruit (9:00 - 10:00 AM)

- In the afternoon, attendees and land yachters are invited to hang around the docks with lemonade, pretzels, and conversation or head up town to explore.
- Potluck dinner, so bring your slow cooker or salads, veggies, etc. (5:30 PM)

Sunday - grab some fruit & muffins before pumping out and heading home with noon checkout.

We need a minimum of 5 boats to use the guest center without fee, and the club will spring for the refundable deposit. Reservation fee is \$10.00, but the first night's moorage for registered boats is only \$25.00 regardless of boat size. The club will collect the reservation fee and first night's moorage. Power is \$3.00 per night and along with the second night's moorage of \$1.00 per foot LOA (\$20.00 minimum) payable to the marina at the gas dock office.


