The object of Coop Charting is to locate and report on geodetic marks and navigation aids to ensure they are in good condition and where they were meant to be located according to charts and maps. Many of us do a combination of water and land cruising which allows for a wide variety of options as to what can be located and documented. The Squadron gets credit for each submittal. If you need help with the process and paperwork contact Jim Harden, the Squadrons point of contact for all things Coop Charting to include submitting the report.

Boating safety on the water includes not only operating your boat safely (i.e. education) but also that your boat meets the safety requirements mandated. The Squadrons point of contact for Vessel Safety Checks is Craig Brown and he will be more than happy to schedule a VSC at your convenience.

I do have a Piloting (Marine Navigation) class scheduled to start September 23 for 10 weeks via Zoom taught by Gary Ball. You won't ever get lost or run aground when you know marine navigation, whether for short day trips or long multi-day cruises.

Learn the essentials of safe coastal and inland navigation using basic GPS in conjunction with charts and other marine data. The *Marine Navigation* course teaches you how to use the GPS along with traditional dead reckoning techniques for planning and laying out safe routes, as well as ensuring that you are on-course while underway.

What's included?

- Charts and their interpretation
- Landmarks and navigation aids (buoys, day marks, lights, etc.)
- Plotting courses and determining direction and distance
- The mariner's compass and converting between True and Magnetic
- Use of GPS basic GPS displays and information they provide, setting up waypoints and routes, staying on a GPS course
- Pre-planning courses and entering them into the GPS
- Monitoring progress and determining position by both GPS and traditional techniques such as bearings and dead reckoning

America's Boating Channel[™] Tips for Towed Sports Safety

The summer is in full swing, which makes the topic of our safety message today even more urgent – Towed Sports Safety. As our waterways become crowded during this time of year, it is vital to identify and implement important measures for safely water skiing, wake boarding, knee boarding, wake surfing, and tubing.



Videos like this one underscore the need for safety considerations when participating in towed sports. Did you know that according to the Coast Guard, towed water sports account for over 400 boating incidents per year. And let's not forget your life jacket when you're out having fun on the water. In addition to a properly fitted life jacket, get one designed for the type of towed sport you are enjoying.



These measures are presented in the "Towed Sports Safety" video where viewers learn about proper equipment selection and preparing to tow a person. For instance, tube ropes should be around 60 feet long and heavier than water ski and wake board ropes that should be about 75 feet long. Also, ski ropes should have more give than wake board ropes. Additionally, the video features tips for operating underway.

- Phone picture application SOLOCATOR (slight cost)
- Phone map application Benchmark (free)

Send the picture to me and I will submit the report for you. Yes, it is just that easy and any member with you (up to 4) will get points. What an easy and fun way to earn you merit mark.




