

Awards

During the District 16 annual spring conference, Tacoma Power Squadron received several cooperative charting awards. The most important was the squadron receiving the national Honor Roll award. It takes seven members participating in the program to earn this award. So, big thanks to our members who participated and hopefully we can do this again in 2024. Two members

received the Triple Anchor Award for participating in three different parts of the Cooperative Charting program. They were Debbie Harden and Jim Harden. If anyone has questions on this fun filled program, please contact me.

2. Cooperative Charting

There are two new ways to participate in the cooperative charting program and you may do most of the work without leaving your home. NOAA is requesting our help in receiving changes to United States Army Corp of Engineers charts and the NOAA charts noting any discrepancies then reporting them. Here are some examples of what they are looking for us to report: Docks/Wharfs that are now gone or having been added, a smokestack that has been removed, bridges that have been added, fish pens that have been added, power lines that have been added/removed, etc. Both of these charting reports consist of a two-part reporting requirement. Since this requires a somewhat lengthy explanation, I ask if anyone would be interested in participating in the part of the nautical part of the program, please contact me.

3. Vessel Safety Checks

As the Springtime of the year approaches, boaters are thinking about getting back on the water and having fun. We need to help the Puget Sound boaters be safer on the water by providing them a VSC. I have been contacted by Shelton Yacht Club and Olympia Yacht Club asking if our squadron would arrange to do VSCs on their safety / clean-up day. So, I am asking all members that belong to yacht clubs or have a yacht club close to them, to ask if they would like TPS to perform VSCs for their members.

The group reservation code will expire 4 weeks before your arrival date, and the slips become publicly available for anyone to make reservations. It is therefore important that the group members make their reservations on time to secure their space in the marina!

Other Important Information:

- Slips will be held up to 4 weeks prior to the arrival date. If the spaces held by the group are not reserved and paid for by the individual group members by the 4 week before arrival mark, those spaces become publicly available.

- Group reservation fees are nonrefundable.

- Guest reservation refunds for individual reservations are available if cancellation is made no less than 14 days in advance of the arrival date.

If attending the Port Orchard rendezvous hosted by Beth and Richard Stone, mark your calendars and be on the lookout for attendance information at a future date.

A quick note from the Nominating Committee. The 2024 slate of elected officers was revised with several nominations from the floor and voted on during the TPS Annual Meeting. The elected slate is filled, but there are still some vacancies in the appointed officers. Take a hard look at your commitment to public service then see if you can spare a few hours a month to fill one of those positions. Boat Handling builds your competence and confidence on the water with an in-depth look at practical boating skills. Learn how to handle your boat in a variety of situations and become the skipper you want to be. Gain confidence in docking, underway, anchoring, and other seamanship skills.

Our new Boat Handling course is intended for newer recreational boaters who have completed a basic boating class (like America's Boating Course) and want to gain more knowledge, skill, and confidence to boat safely and have more fun in a variety of situations.

Boat Handling covers these topics:

- Rules of the Road: A Practical Approach
- Confidence in Docking and Undocking: Slow-Speed Maneuvering
- Boating with Confidence: Handling Your Boat Under Way
- Anchoring with Assurance: Don't Get Carried Away
- Emergencies on Board: Preparation for Handling Common Problems
- Knots and Line Handling: The Knots You Need to Know

America's Boating Channel[™] Warns of Electric Shock Drowning

Electric Shock Drowning (ESD) is a little-known and oftenunidentified killer, severely injuring and killing people every year. It occurs when faulty wiring sends electric current into water, which passes through the body and

causes muscle paralysis that can result in drowning.

Faulty wiring or the use of damaged electrical cords and other devices on docks and boats can cause the surrounding water to become "energized," with no visible warning. Avoid getting in the water within 150 feet of where AC power is in use and learn how to test if dangerous electrical currents are in the water around your boat.

To help boaters understand the danger of Electric Shock Drowning (ESD), Season Four of America's Boating Channel offers the video "<u>Electric Shock Drowning (ESD)</u>." The video shows how ESD causes deaths and injuries at marinas nationwide, including many undetected incidents. Viewers also will learn about ESD prevention and how to install ground protection on docks and boats. Also featured are differences between ESD dangers in saltwater and freshwater.
