of National, District, and Squadrons will end on Dec. 1st, 2024. Although National is trying to get an extension to cover us for another six months, they are prioritizing finding alternative insurance to cover us all. Chubb decided to stop covering us because of an incident involving one squadron involving a substantial amount of money. So, they decided to cancel our coverage after Dec. 1st. This will leave us in a position to find our own insurance coverage or go Bare, as they say. Going without insurance leaves the squadron, its officers, and its directors potentially liable for their wrongful acts. Meanwhile, the District is seeking general liability insurance to protect members. There will be much more discussion about this shortly. If you have questions or comments, bring them to the next General meeting.

As always, I'm here to answer any questions or concerns you may have. Let's continue to navigate these changes together.

Fall Maintenance

The beginning of fall is upon us and for some of us that means starting to think about preparing for freezing weather. It is easy to find any number of checklists on the web to help you with these lists, just search 'winterizing' and take your pick. There are probably even checklists in your boat's

manuals and manufacture's recommendations specific to your pride and joy.

A sample of check list topics and a partial subset of each may look somewhat like this:

- Inboard Engine(s)
 - Fluid(s) check and/or replacement, fogging oil in cylinders
- Stern Drive(s)
 - o Gear case oil, propeller/propeller shafts, Seals, Rubber Boots
- Outboard Engine(s)
 - Gear case oil, propeller/propeller shafts
- Fuel
 - Add fuel stabilizer, top off fuel tank
- Bilges
 - $\circ \quad \ \ Clean \ and \ dry$
- Fresh Water System
 - o Drain tank, isolate hot water tank, pump non-toxic antifreeze throughout system
- Holding Tank(s)
 - Add antifreeze to tanks and pump through hoses, y-valve, macerator, discharge hose
- Interior
 - Remove valuables, stand pillows/cushions on edge so air can circulate around them, open/clean all drawers and lockers, open and clean refrigerator(s) and freezer(s)
 - Install dehumidifier or use commercial odor/ moisture absorber product
- Out of Water Storage
 - Pressure wash hull, clean thru-hulls, open seacocks, check hull for damage, check and charge batteries, clean terminals, check bilge pumps and float switches
- In Water Storage
 - Close all seacocks, check rudder shafts/stuffing boxes for leaks, clean thru-hulls, open seacocks, check and charge batteries, clean terminals, check bilge pumps and float switches
- Trailer
 - Check tires for wear, check/grease wheel bearings, check trailer lights and function, check/grease trailer tongue hitch lock, check safety chains



As I have gotten 'older and wiser and the spring in my step has sprung', you can do what I have done for the past few years, hire a marine shop to do the heavy lifting. My boat is stored on a trailer and is raw water cooled so protecting the engine from sustaining any water freezing damage is paramount. The folks I let do it run the engine and outdrive in antifreeze for 15 minutes or so, then shut it down so that all the nooks and crannies are filled with antifreeze. They also do the inspection and service of all the other systems listed above.

Time and money spent now pays dividends in the spring when you get antsy to be out boating again. I usually put my boat in storage in October or early November when the marine shop is less busy and to free up my time for the holidays.


